

www.hrhprincegeorge.co.uk - Cybersquatters cash in on two day old Royal baby, HRH Prince George Alexander Louis

Over 178 domain names connected to the new Royal's 'name', have been secured within hours of the announcement

London, **UK**, **25 July 2013**: names.co.uk, one of the UK's top domain name registrars, today reveals that opportunistic cybersquatters are attempting to cash in on the Duke and Duchess of Cambridge's new born by registering websites associated with HRH Prince George Alexander Louis.

Over 178 domain names connected to the new Royal's name were secured within hours. The first of which was a Portuguese domain-name broker who registered the web address GeorgeAlexanderLouis.com moments after Prince William and Kate announced the name of their newborn.

Others domains squatted include:

- princegeorgecambridge co.uk registered on 22/07/2013
- hrhprincegeorge co.uk registered on 22/07/2013
- hisroyalhighnessprincegeorgeofcambridge co.uk registered on 24/07/2013
- princegeorgeofcambridge.com registered on 19/07/2013
- kinggeorge.com registered on 29/06/2013

Several websites are already clearly for sale. Susan Millett from Florida USA, the owner of http://royalprincegeorgealexanderlouis.co.uk/ is already advertising for a buyer for the domain name, at the 'cheap price' of 599 US dollars. Mr Scott Melville from the UK has not put a price on his http://royalbabygeorge.co.uk/ domain and is instead asking buyers to contact him to discuss purchase.

Social Media feeds such as @Prince_1_George and facebook pages were also registered within hours of the public announcement. facebook.com/PrinceGeorgeOfCambridge has already gained over 114,834 likes.

Surprisingly, there were a few domain names left that the cybersquatters had not yet registered, for example HRHKingPrinceGeorgeAlexanderLouis.com.

Some legitimate businesses may also see a rise in traffic because their websites domain names are related to the new royal baby. The King George Hotel which owns the Kinggeorge.com domain since 1996 is sure to see an increase!

Sally Tomkotowicz, Customer Acquisition Manager for names.co.uk explains: "The announcement of the Royal baby's name caused an absolute gold rush of people registering domain names associated with the future King. We've not seen cybersquatting on this scale since the announcement of the new Pope in March."



"No sooner had the announcement been made by the Palace, opportunistic cybersquatters from around the world began registering key domain names connected to HRH Prince George Alexander Louis. With a number of websites and twitter feeds already set up for George, he is likely to be Britain's first truly digital prince."

The Royal family is no stranger to losing out on domain names related to them. Four generations of Royal Family have now fallen prey to domain name hijackings. Prince William and Kate Middleton were caught out by cybersquatters who swooped in on the WillsAndKate.com and WillsAndKate.co.uk website addresses. Squatters hopped on the baby bandwagon as early as January 2012 by registering sites such as www.katewilliambaby.com to take advantage of the Royal couple's news.

The baby's grandfather Prince Charles has also lost key domains, with his UK website www.princecharles.co.uk taken by a professional Prince Charles impersonator. Meanwhile the baby's Great Grandfather, the Duke of Edinburgh has had his taken by a pub, www.thedukeofedinburgh.co.uk.

Sally explains cybersquatting in more detail: "Cybersquatting can involve registering, trafficking or using a domain name in bad faith and with intent to profit from the goodwill of a trademark belonging to someone else. Cybersquatters sometimes offer to sell the domain to the person or company who owns a trademark at an inflated price."

"At names.co.uk we like to highlight the importance of individuals and businesses registering the right domain name on day one. This oversight by the Royals shows that even the most high profile institutions can forget the importance of protecting the future King's brand."
